

- Weekly designated craft, movie, game and gym nights




FUNDRAISING AND DONATIONS

WE RAISED \$3,869 FROM STREET FAIR PARKING.








EVENTS



GAUNT PARK POOL

- We sold 122 YS resident family passes, 9 senior passes, 4 junior passes, 9 adult and 2 adult +1
- We sold 31 non resident family passes, 3 senior pass and 6 adult passes

Swimming for All

- 7 family passes
- 1 junior pass
- 1 senior
- 1 adult
- 1 adult plus minor

A lot of gift passes were bought for families and individuals. This program is still under utilized and I am hoping this year to have it be more seen.

This program is funded by the Yellow Springs Community foundation who also funded the new lift chair.



ACTIVITIES

- Averaged 88 visitors per day
- The John Bryan Youth center attended the pool every Wednesday with lunch every week provided by us and the Beloved Community Project
- SeaDogs utilized the pool for practices and home swim meets June-July
- We offered free swimming lessons to any Village resident











LIFEGUARD STAFF

Certifications can cost anywhere from \$200-300 and recertification is about half of that cost which makes it hard to get new staff interested. We have been lucky to have return staff year after year but they still have to pay their recertification fees. This issue was brought to light during the season and we had some generous donations to help with those costs this upcoming season from Gilah Pomeranz and Noreda Alexander. Staff is required to attend inservices every other week to keep up their skills













We hosted our first lifeguard certification course and pulled one new guard from it. I am looking forward to holding another this year as well as a recertification class.
